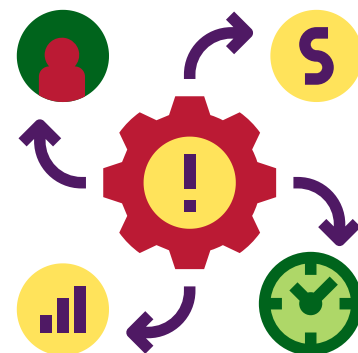

ABOUT US

The Impact We Wish to Deliver

- **Integration of underprivileged students** into the public education system
- **Increased student retention** in public schools
- **Improved health indices** (body weight, height, BMI) through meal supplements and regular health checkups
- **Overall personality development** through specialized learning programs



Key interventions We Make



- **Classroom teaching** in foundational subjects such as English, Hindi, Maths, EVS and Computer science - to reinforce concepts and help students “catch up” to their peers
- **Nutritional support** with 1 meal a day with minimum of 500 calories, 8 grams of protein, and other vital nutrients
- **Health check-ups** including anemia testing, immunization support, and eye check ups

AFTER SCHOOL CLUB

Our 'After-School Club' (ASC) program aims to supplement the functioning of the mainstream public education system for the community, by focusing on the following activities.

- We work towards helping 'out of school children in developing the basic skills needed for them to be ready to take on formal learning in schools.
- We also provide after-school support in the form of doubt clearance and reinforcement of key concepts for children who are already enrolled in government schools.
- We essentially incentivise participation and involvement in learning through parent engagement and incentives like the provision of school supplies and learning aids, a meal supplement per day, as well as regular free health check-ups for the holistic development of our children.

Our unrelenting efforts at ASC have led us to observe several lasting outcomes in children.

- A VU ASC Graduate is an individual ready to face the world with confidence and commitment.
- We instil in children a zeal for continued learning.
- There is a sense of readiness for formal school in children.
- Our purposeful aids help them in better retention and performance in formal school.
- Their overall physical and mental health is also enhanced by our multifaceted approach.
- They're equipped to form better relationships with the community, including peers and adults.



Impact

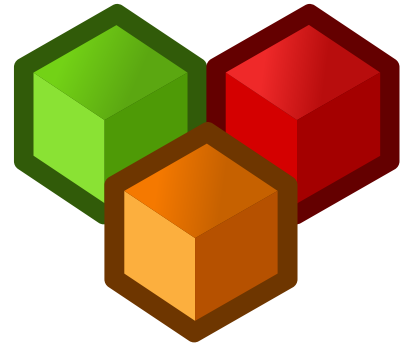
With every passing day, we come closer and closer to our vision of making a difference in as many lives as we can.

- The knowledge that they gain plants in them is self-belief and efficacy.



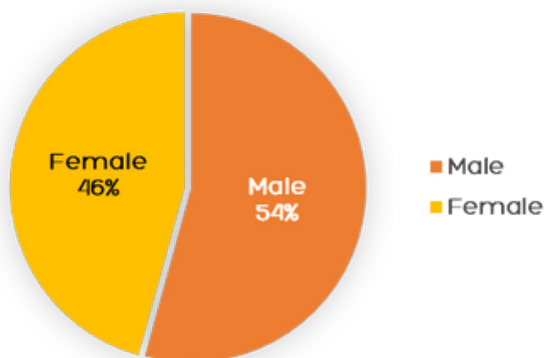
AFTER SCHOOL CLUBS: THE NEW PARADIGM

The three Vision Unlimited After School Clubs cater to five slum clusters in Kadarapur, Badshahpur, which house about 625 families. This is what we know of our 300+ students from October through December 2022.

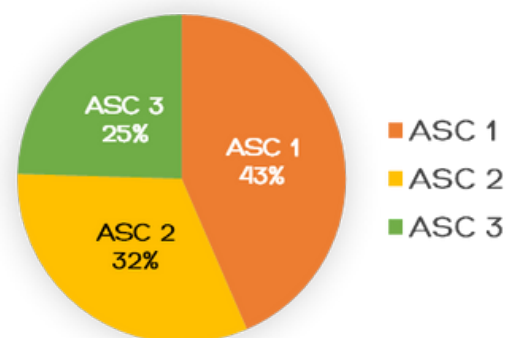


The children came back to school after a month long summer camp- the kids did well, and there was no significant loss of learning since we had one hour of regular tuition through the summer camp also. The kids came back to school with enthusiasm, and participated in both, academic and various extracurricular activities.

Gender Ration

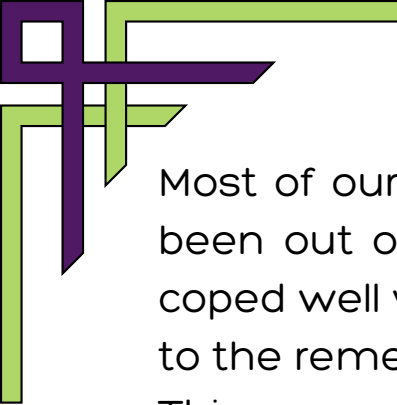

Most of our students are first generation learners, and have been out of school even before the pandemic. But they've coped well with the learning loss- responding enthusiastically to the remedial lessons which were the need of the hour.

This was a time for catch-up learning, with pupils and teachers alike, pulling up their socks for the long haul. This was also the time for joyous celebration: the festive season and the coming new year, and our children and their families, like the rest of the city, were happiest to enjoy the early winters.

HEALTH & NUTRITION

Midday Meal for Our Children

Our community kitchens continue to operate. Our school mothers are paid to cook for the children. Each of the ASCs have a fully functioning kitchen and their own cook, who are the happiest to cook, and serve, lunch to our students six days a week.



This meant a freshly prepared, nutritious meal for our children, which is served to them piping hot on the school premises, by one of the school mothers, and our teachers. The food requirements for all clubs are taken care of by private donations.

Continued support from the local community with biscuits, juices and other sweet treats meant our children often had a snack in addition to the hot lunch. This quarter also saw a lot of treats- friends and families celebrated Children' Day, Diwali and Christmas with our children.

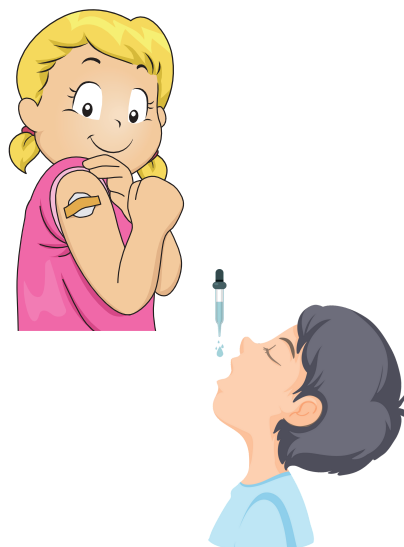

Immunisation

The eligible children were administered Polio drops by the local PHC workers in the last week of January, as a mop up round of immunisation in ASC 1, 2 and 3.

Additionally, all the children above the age of 12 years, have received at least one dose of the COVID vaccine, in keeping with the nationwide immunisation program.



STAFF REORGANISATION AND RECRUITMENT

All of our teachers made sure the overall learning and development of our students was not hampered by the festivities in the air. The Christmas Carnival brought out their other talents to the fore, as the teachers and pupils prepared for their first major stage performance in front of a huge audience. Ms Sadhana joined the organisation, Ms Babita was relieved of her teaching responsibilities as she took over supervisory duties full time, for all three Clubs. . Ms Meenu and Ms Niki, our substitute teacher, very ably bridged the gap, when Ms Shashi was on a long week to celebrate a family wedding.

Our cooks in ASC 1 and 2 are both school moms and will continue to cook for us. The kitchen in ASC 3 will be shut starting the new year, because a lot of children have left for their village, and so has our cook. For now, the children will be served a meal bought from a local vendor, as that is proving to be more cost effective. . The children in all three clubs continue to get a hot lunch, six days a week. The food is served to the kids, and the cooks also do the dishes for the younger children. The older children wash their own plates.

Another school mom is paid to clean the ASC 2 six days a week, especially the kitchen, hallways, and the bathroom. The children are also responsible for keeping their classrooms clean



Annual Eye Camp

All our children had annual eye check up with Dr Shibal Bhartiya and Optometrist Mr Tarun Goyal at ASC 2 on the 13th of November, 2022. All children with eye allergies and refractive errors were given the appropriate treatment in consultation with their parents.

The data collected is being analysed in conjunction with Government Medical College, Chandigarh; and Chacha Nehru Hospital, New Delhi so as to help formulate better protocols for eye health in these vulnerable children.



Lung Function Tests

All our children above the age of eight, had a Lung function Test, on the 4th of Decemebr, 2022 under the supervision of Dr Manoj Goel, Director Pulmonology, at Fortis Memorial Institute. All children with restrictive airway disease and asthma, were seen by a paediatric pulmonologist, in the presence of their parents, and the appropriate treatment started.

The data collected is being analysed in conjunction with Postgraduate Institute of Medical Education and Research (PGIMER), Chandigarh, so as to help formulate better protocols for respiratory health in these vulnerable children.

Both our volunteers coached and led the children in singing the national anthem, as well as our school song, Hum Honge Kamyab, on the guitar.

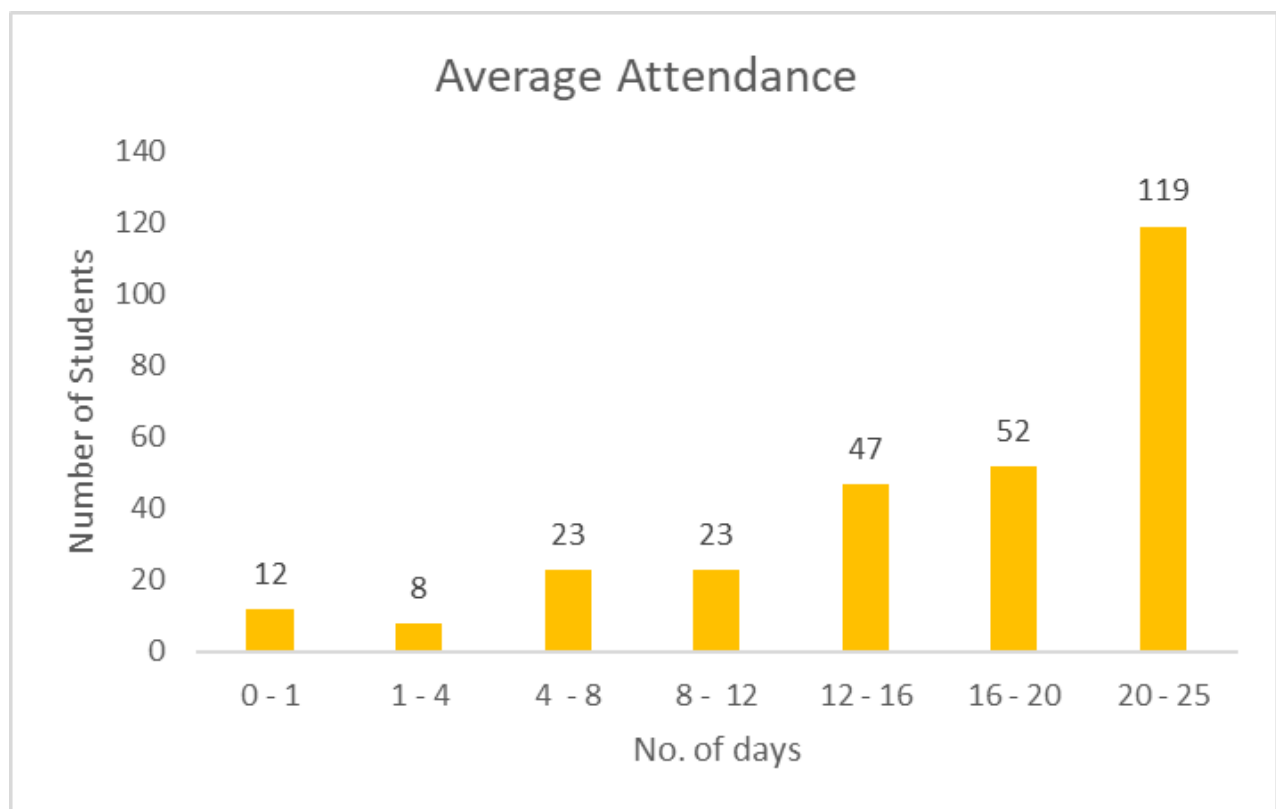

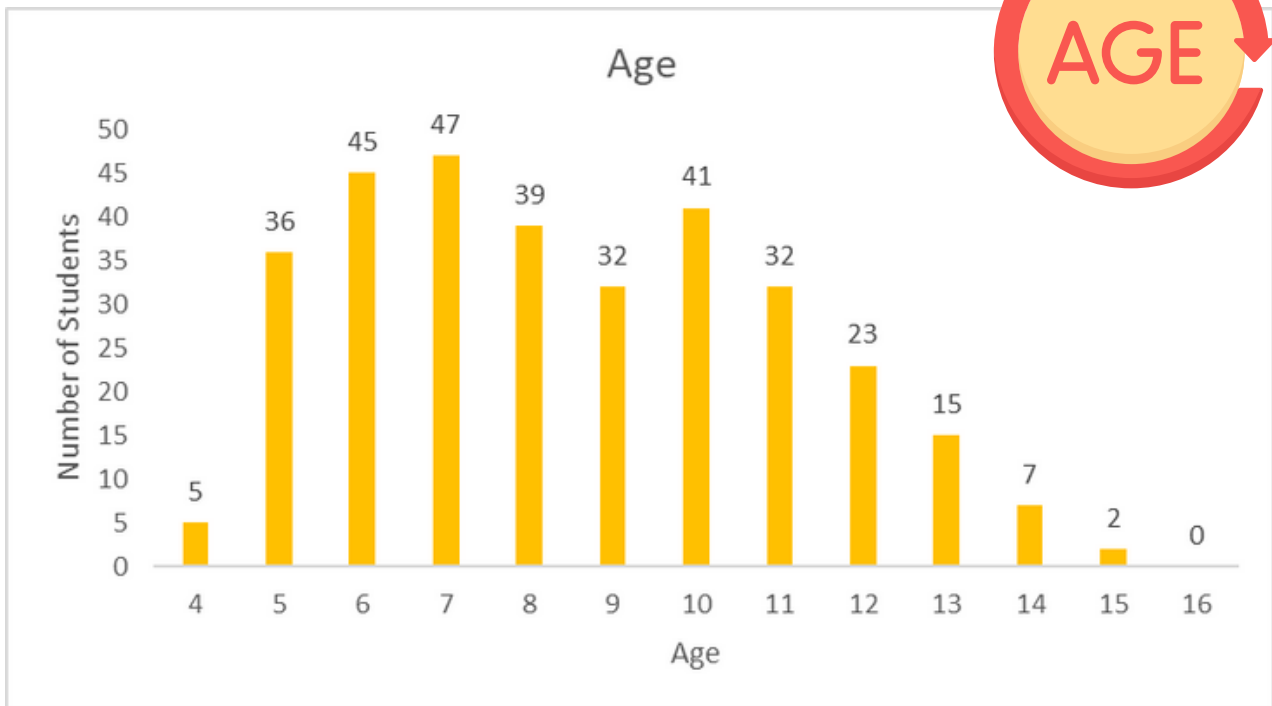

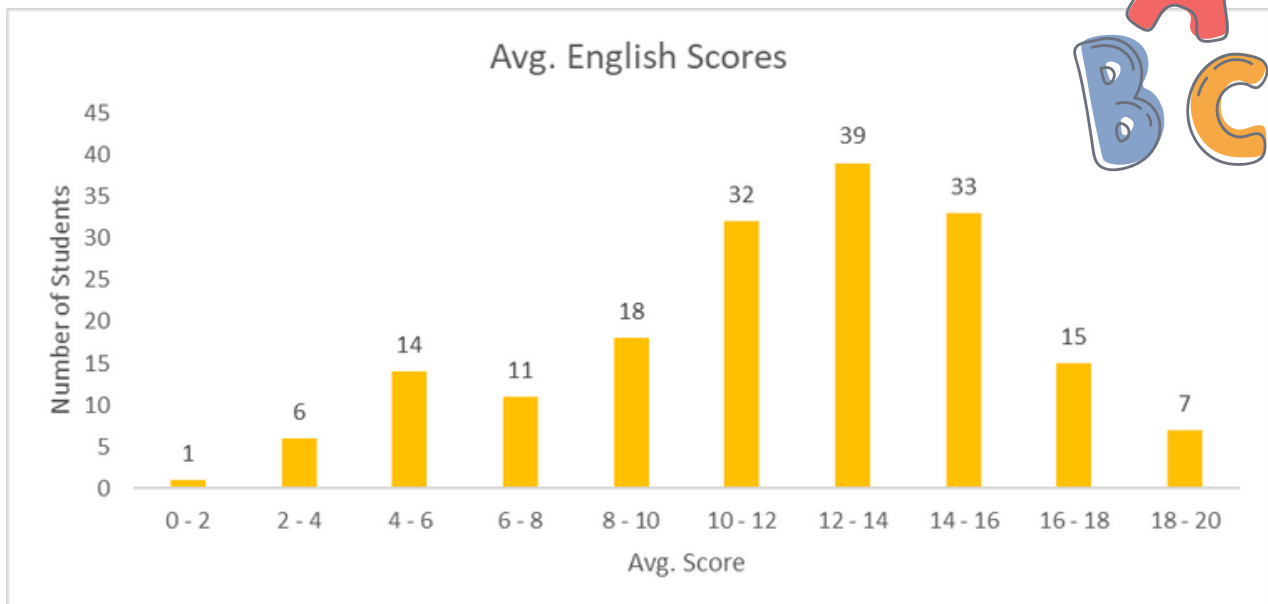
Attendance

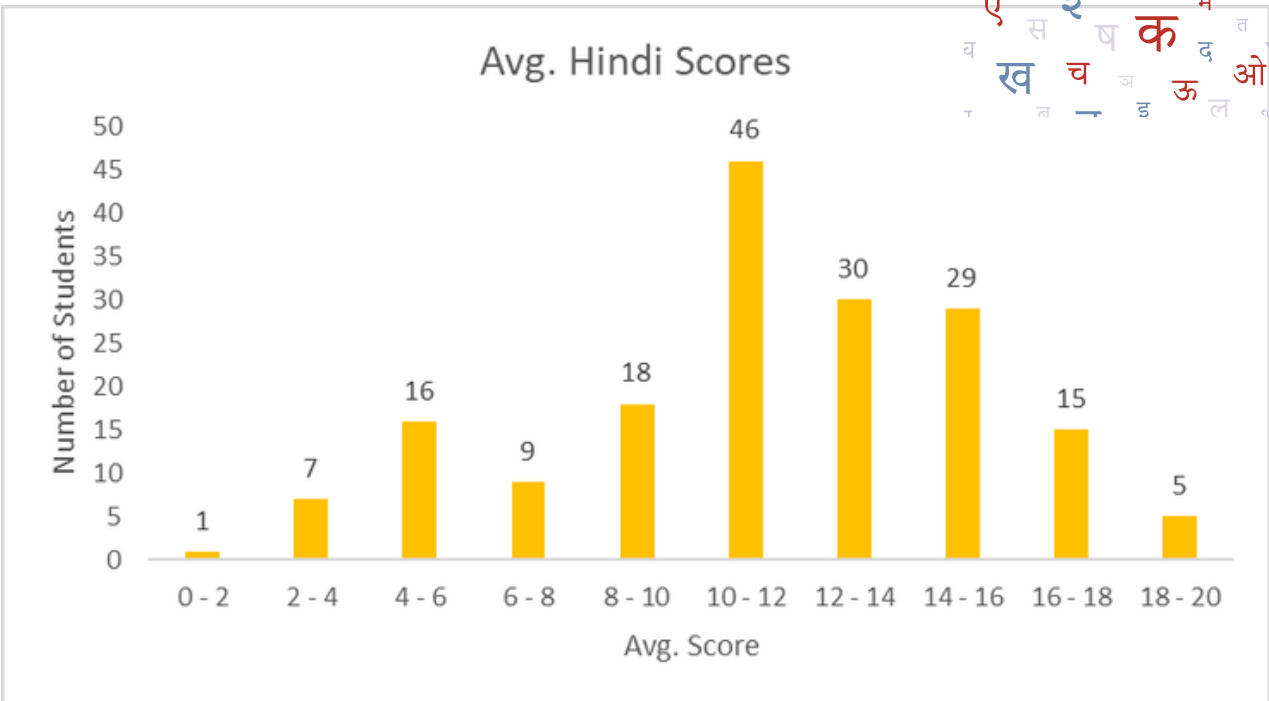
Academic Scores - English



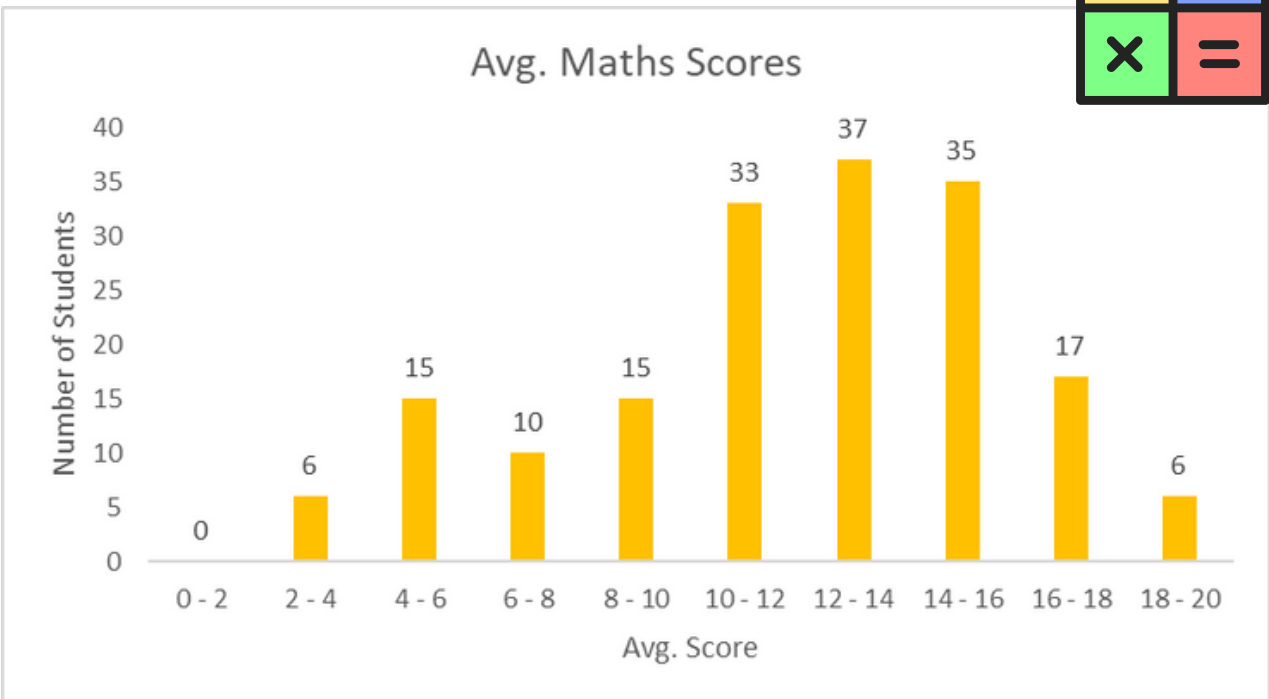
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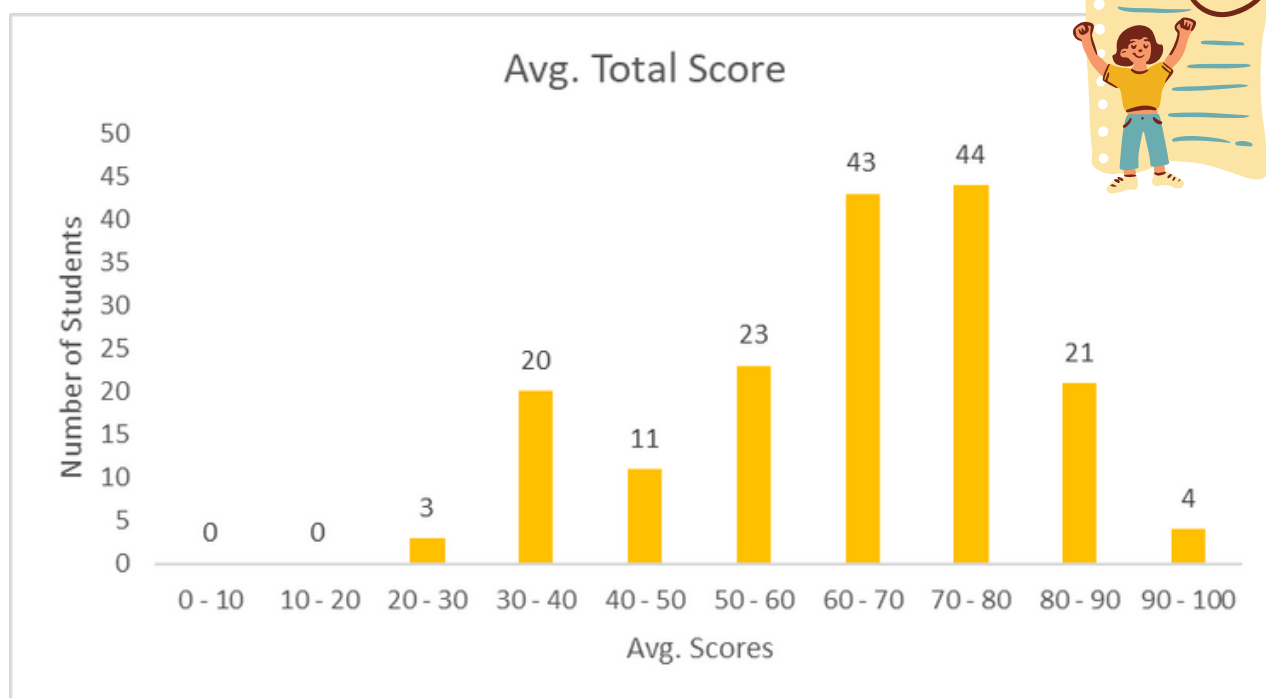
Academic Scores - Hindi



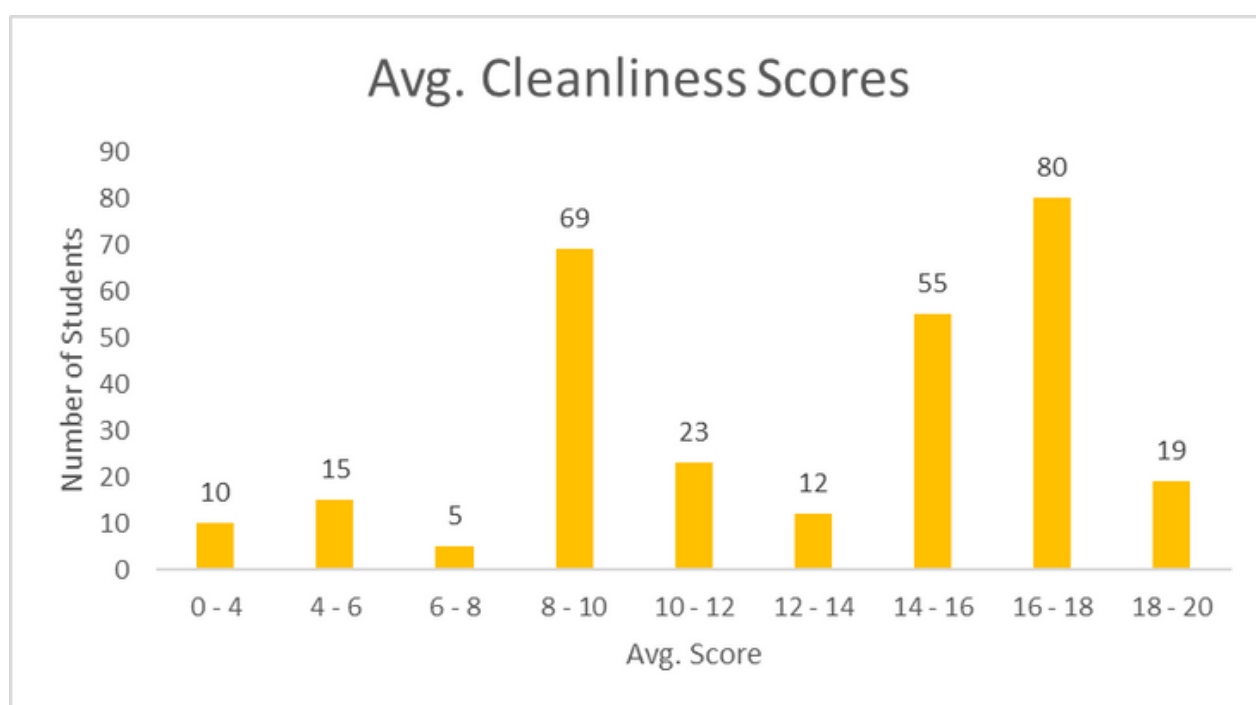
Academic Scores - Maths



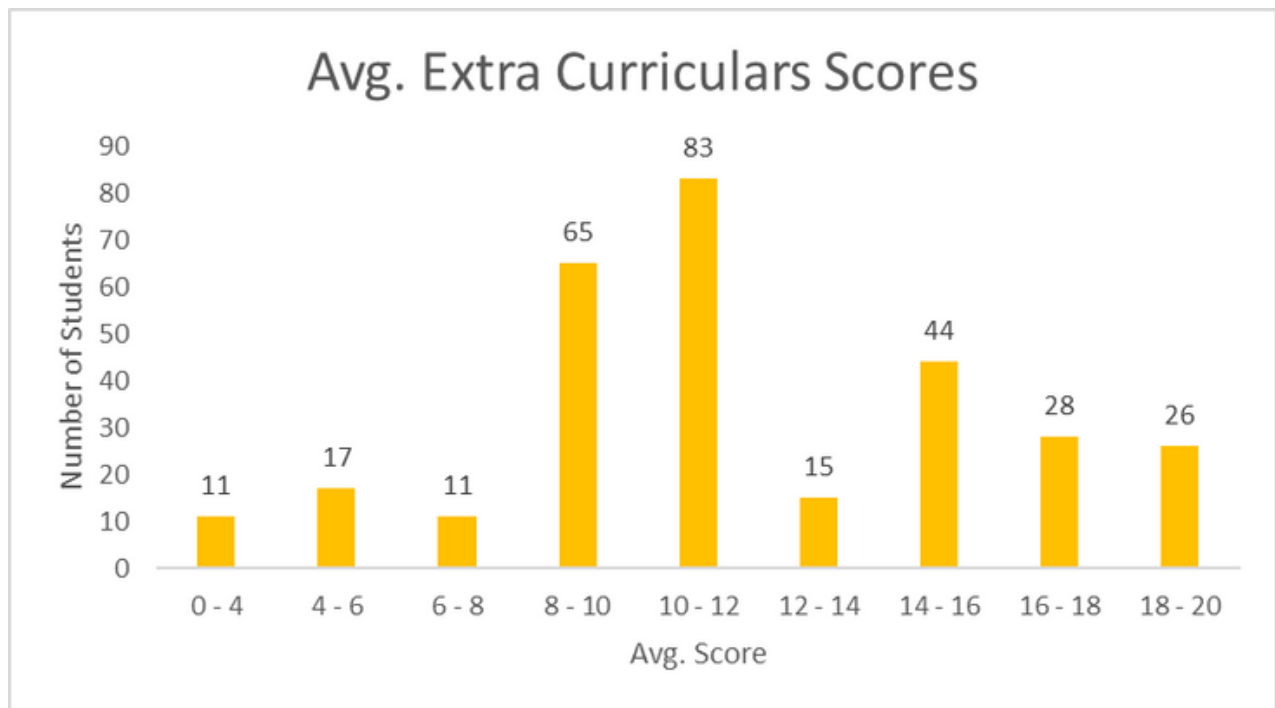
Overall Academic Scores



Cleanliness Performance

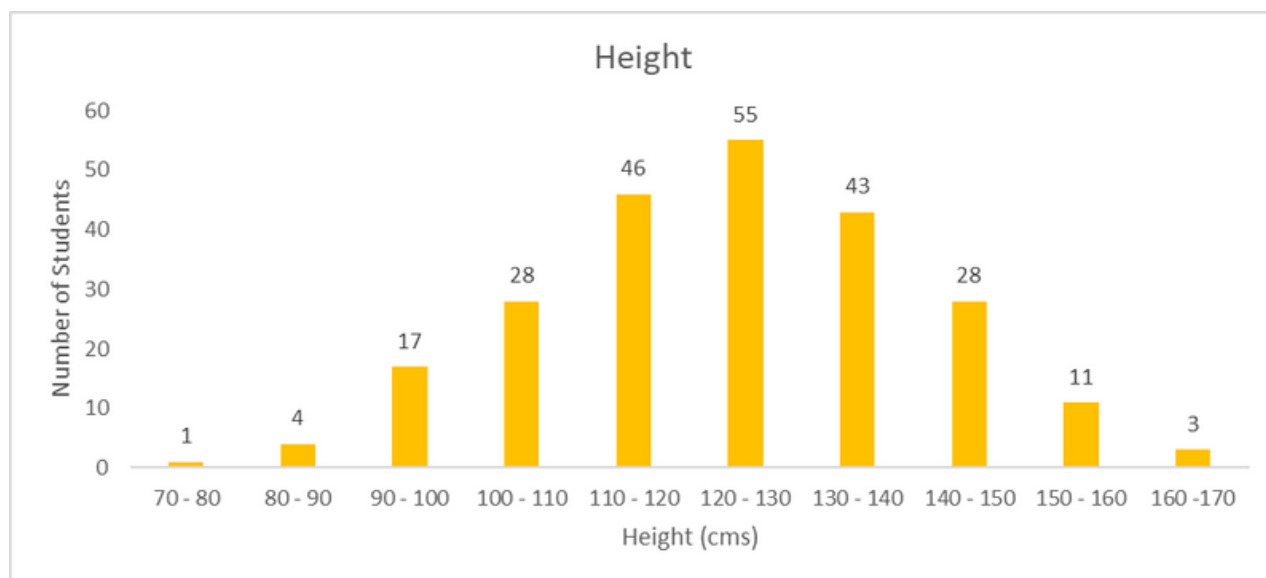


Extra curricular Scores

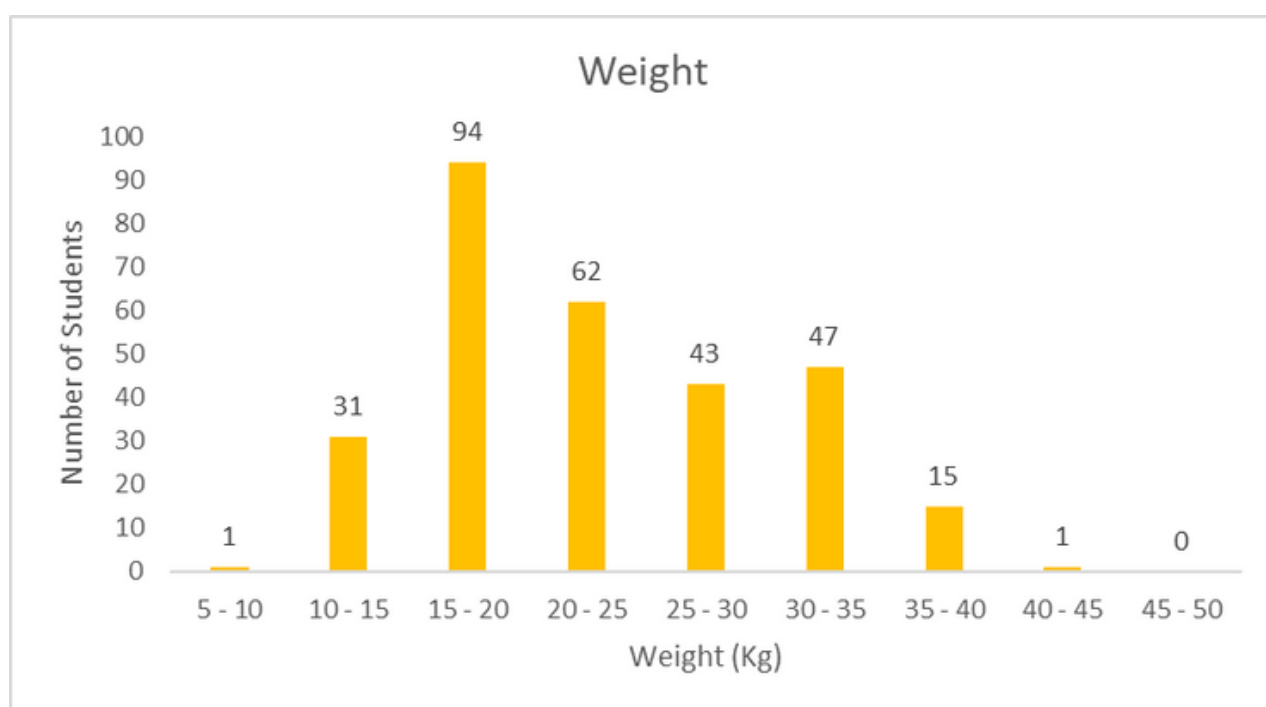
