Our 'After-School Club' (ASC) program in Gurugram, Haryana, aims to supplement the functioning of the mainstream public education system for underprivileged, transitional communities, by focusing on the following activities.

We work towards helping 'out of school children in developing the basic skills needed for them to be ready to take on formal learning in schools.

We also provide after-school support in the form of doubt clearance and reinforcement of key concepts for children who are already enrolled in government schools.

We essentially incentivise participation and involvement in learning through parent engagement and incentives like the provision of school supplies and learning aids, a meal supplement per day, as well as regular free health check-ups for the holistic development of our children in the urban slums of Badshahpur, Gurugram.

INTRODUCTION

The Impact We Wish to Deliver

- Integration, and increased retention of underprivileged students from transitional communities, into the public education system
- Improved health indices (body weight, height, BMI) through meal supplements and regular health check-ups
- Overall personality development through specialized learning programs

What We Do

- **Classroom teaching** in foundational subjects such as English, Hindi, Maths, EVS and Computer science – to reinforce concepts and help students “catch up” to their peers.
- **Nutritional support** with 1 meal a day with minimum of 500 calories, 8 grams of protein, and other vital nutrients.
- **Health check-ups** including anemia testing, immunization support, and eye check ups

Monthly recording of height, weight.. On schedule supplements, and help with healthcare navigation.

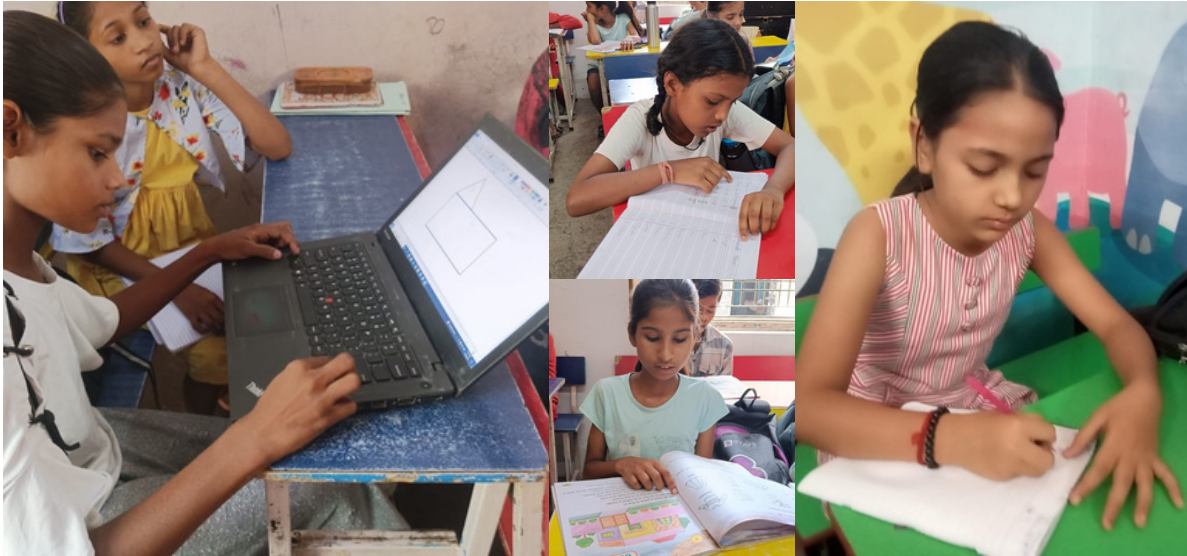

ACADEMICS

Children attending the Vision Unlimited After School Club show steady academic improvement. Regular support with homework, personalized attention, and engaging learning activities have enhanced their understanding and performance in core subjects. Teachers report increased confidence, better classroom participation, and a positive attitude toward learning among the students.



NUTRITION

Feeding India now provides our children with nutritious hot meals daily. This collaboration means our students are well-nourished, which will promote their overall well-being- and enhance their capacity to learn and thrive academically. Together, we are fostering a healthier, more focused learning environment.



EXERCISE AND PLAY

Exercise and play help children stay healthy, happy, and active. At Vision Unlimited After School Club, we encourage fun activities that build strength, teamwork, and confidence. Through games and movement, children develop better focus, learn new skills, and grow stronger every day—both in body and mind.. the children stepped outside to play. Of course the morning exercise remains a part of our curriculum.



GIRLS CIRCLE

The girls get together to discuss problems related to adolescence, menstrual health and any other problems that they face. The teachers are the facilitators for the dialogue, finding solutions for their problems, and help them with healthcare navigation.



DAYCARE CENTER

Our after school clubs usually take children above the age of four. But many of our older children are also child minders for their younger siblings, as their mothers go to work. They can, therefore, not attend school.

To help them continue their education, we started a small play area for children even two years old, in the ASCs. We now have forty children in this program. All our ASCs now support our older students by taking care of their younger siblings during school hours.



SPECIAL ABILITIES PROGRAM

SAb is our program for including children with special abilities into our Club. We have twenty children in our family who struggle to come to the Club because of physical, emotional or intellectual limitations. Our teachers visit them twice a week, at home, with little treats, snacks, and teach them at home.

The program is now getting a much needed facelift - Rao Inderjit Singh uncle, our Member of Parliament, has given us a comfortable, new car so the children can now come to school instead, and study with their peers!

PTM

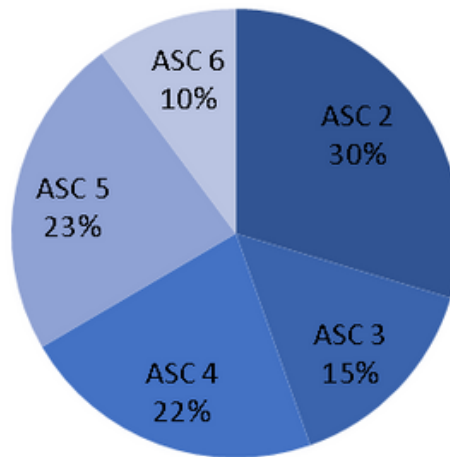

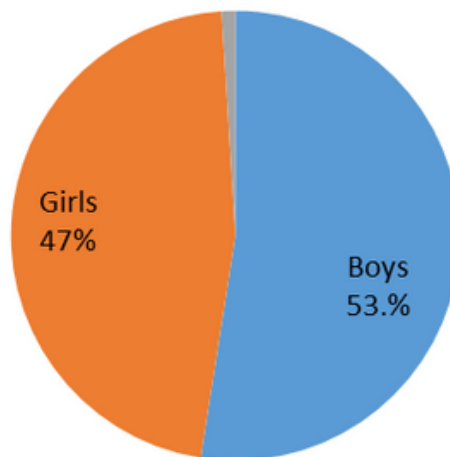


Students & Gender Diversity

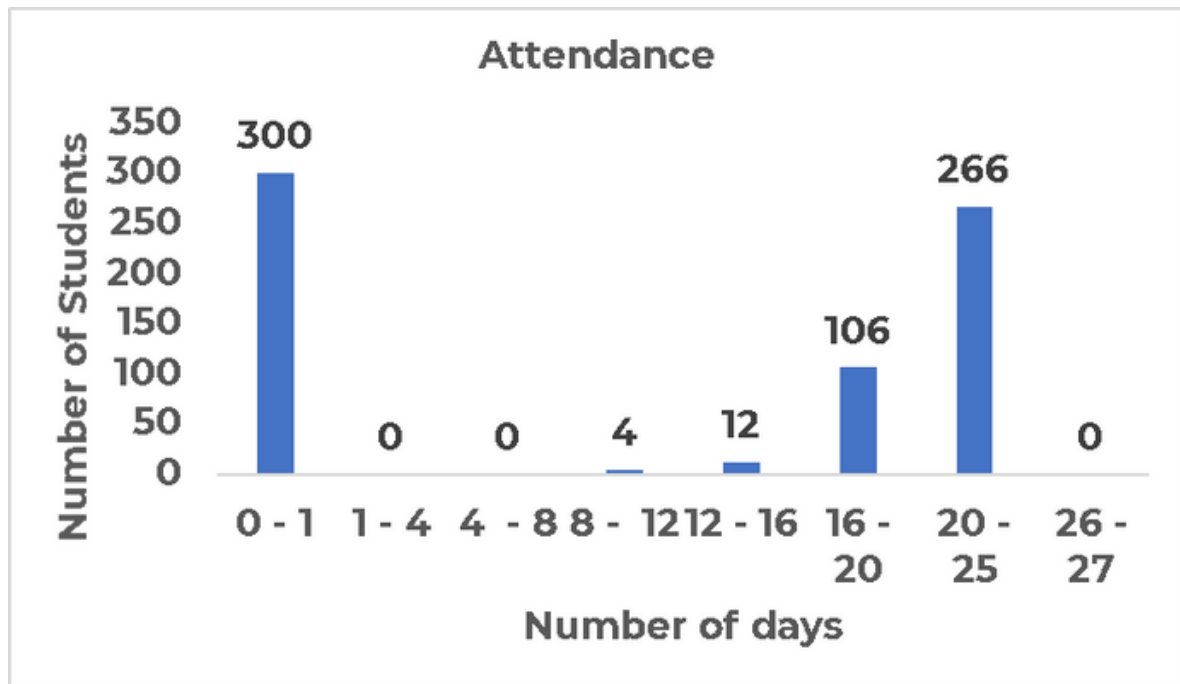
Total number of Students



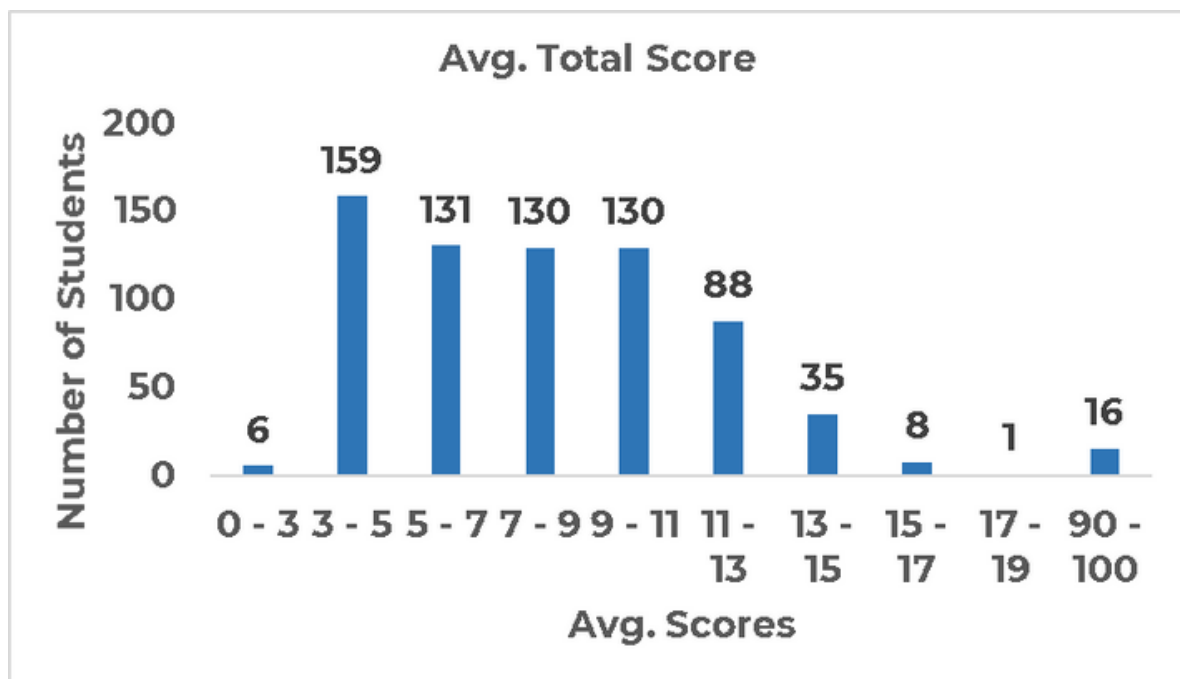
Gender Ratio



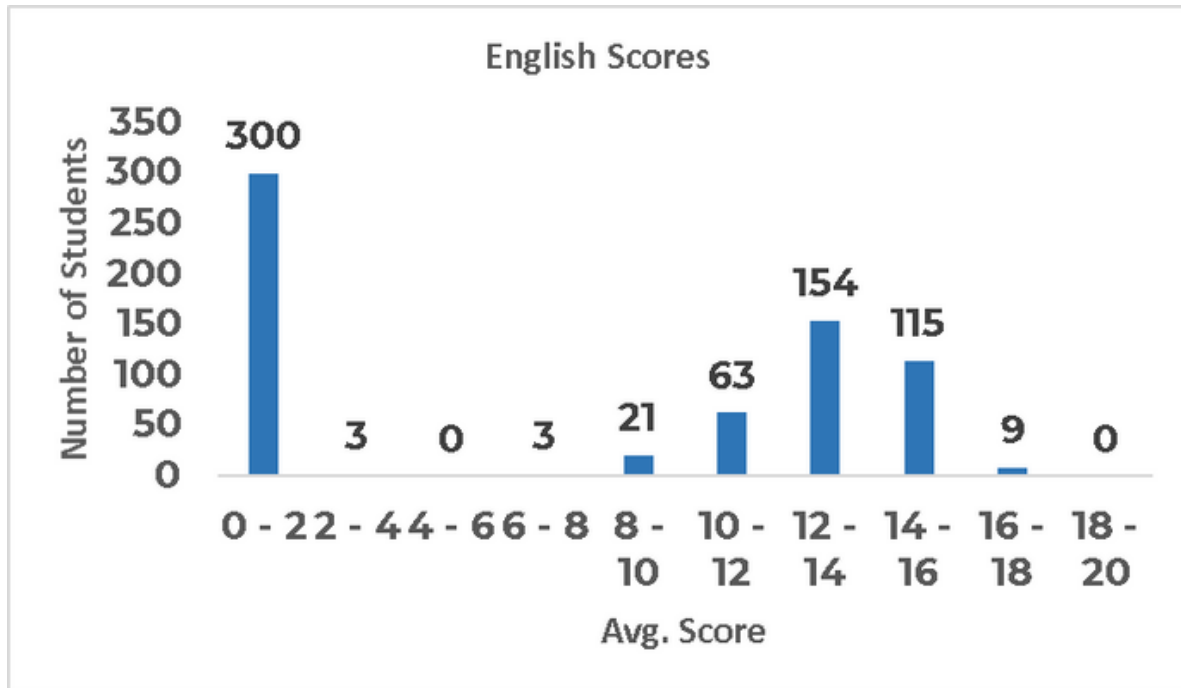

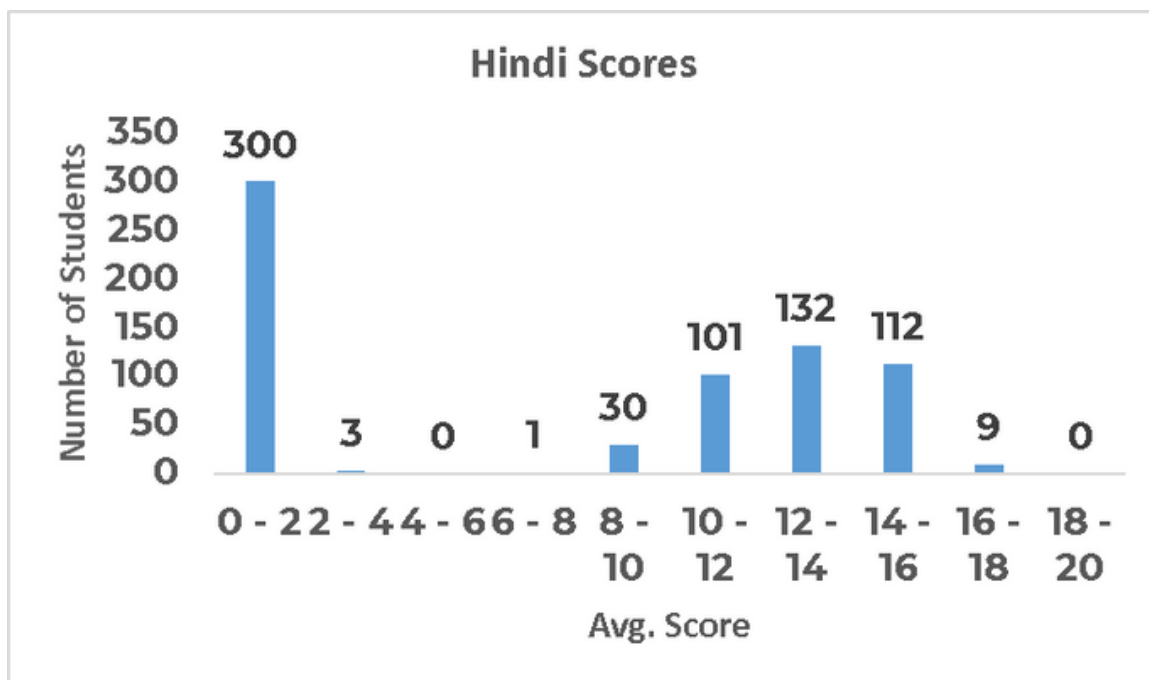

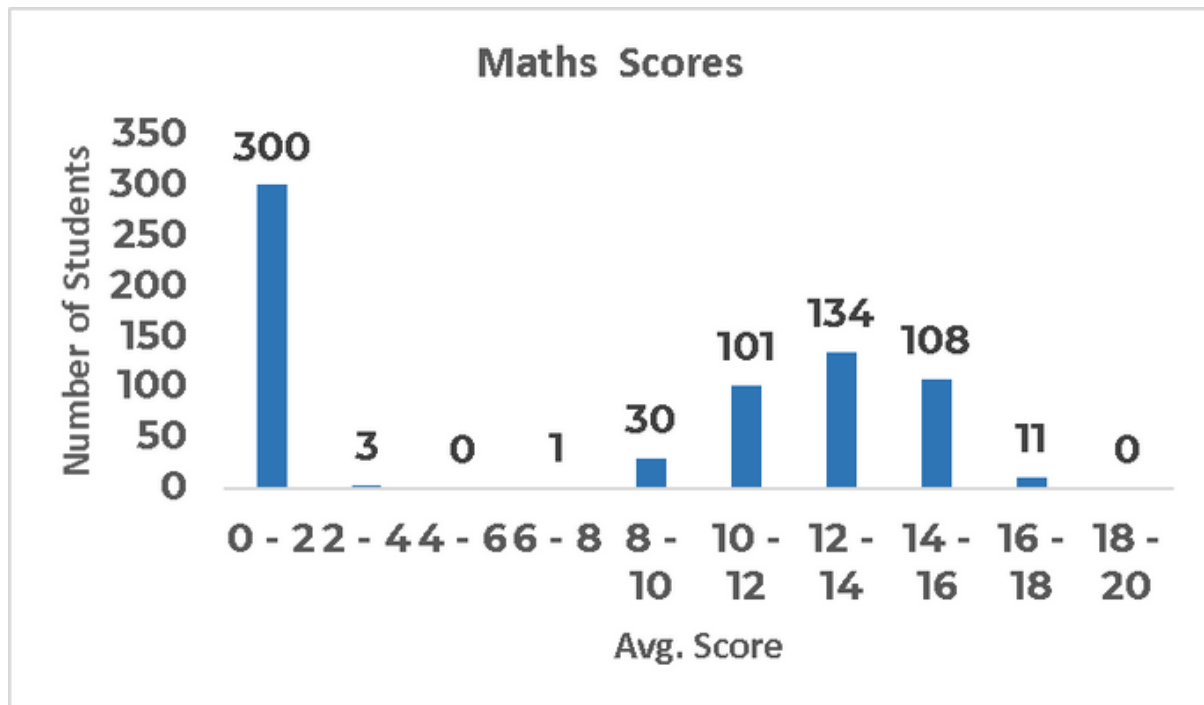
ASSESSMENT - ENGLISH



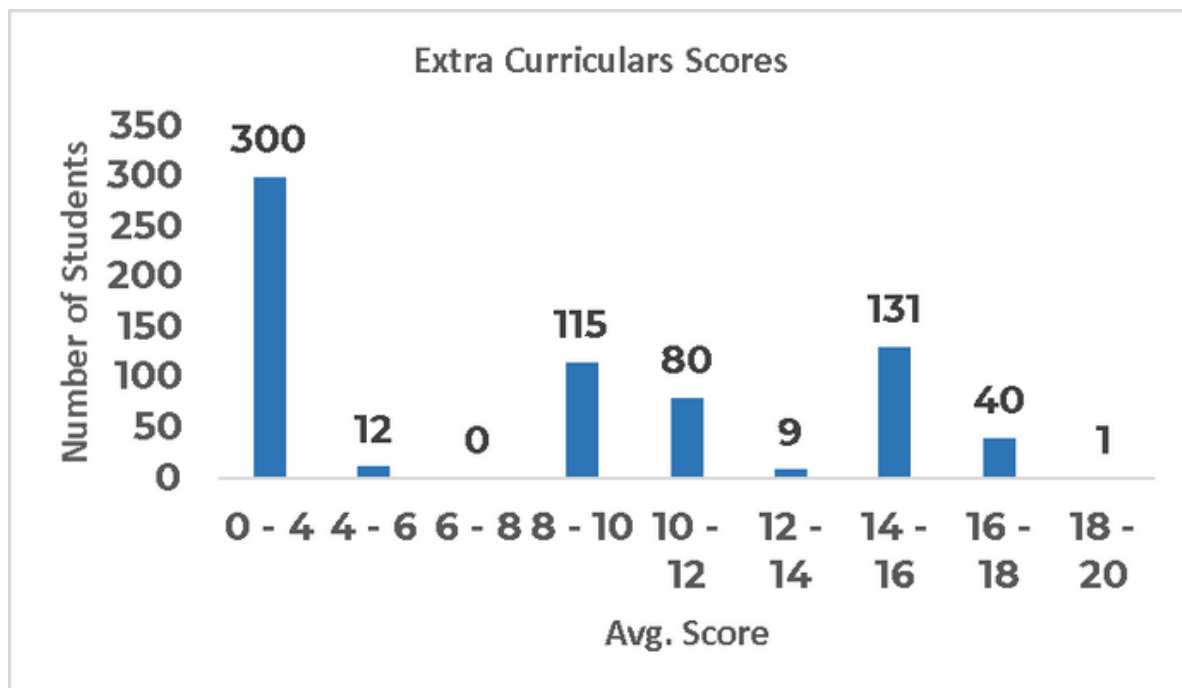
ASSESSMENT - HINDI



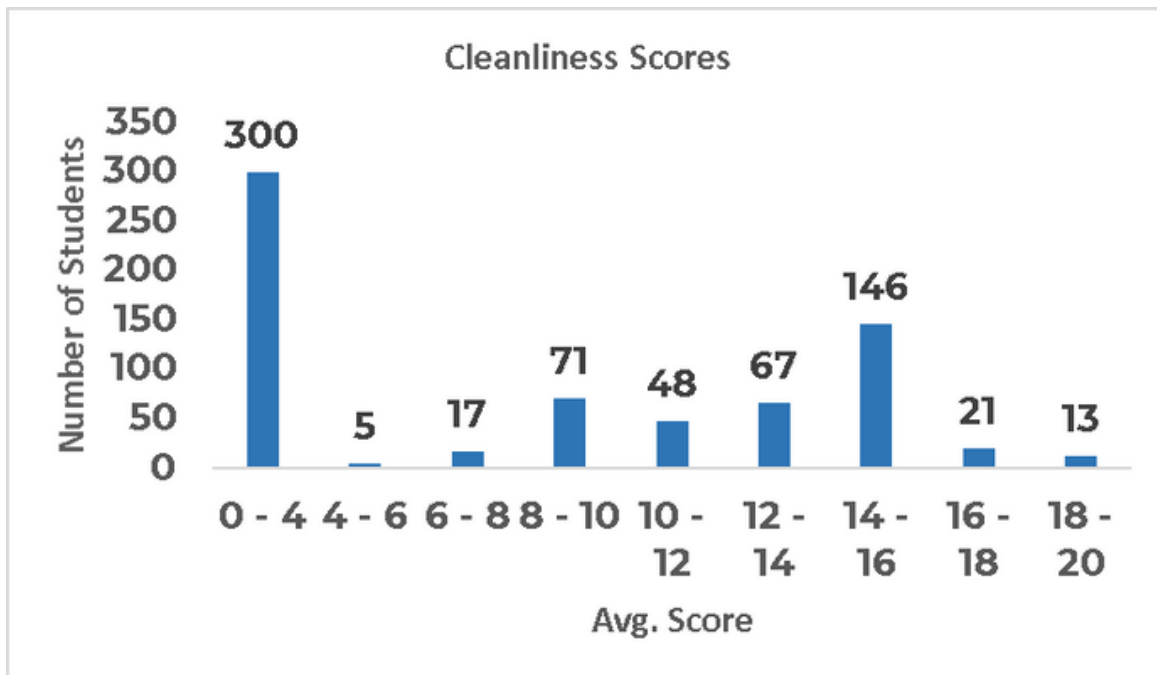
ASSESSMENT - MATH



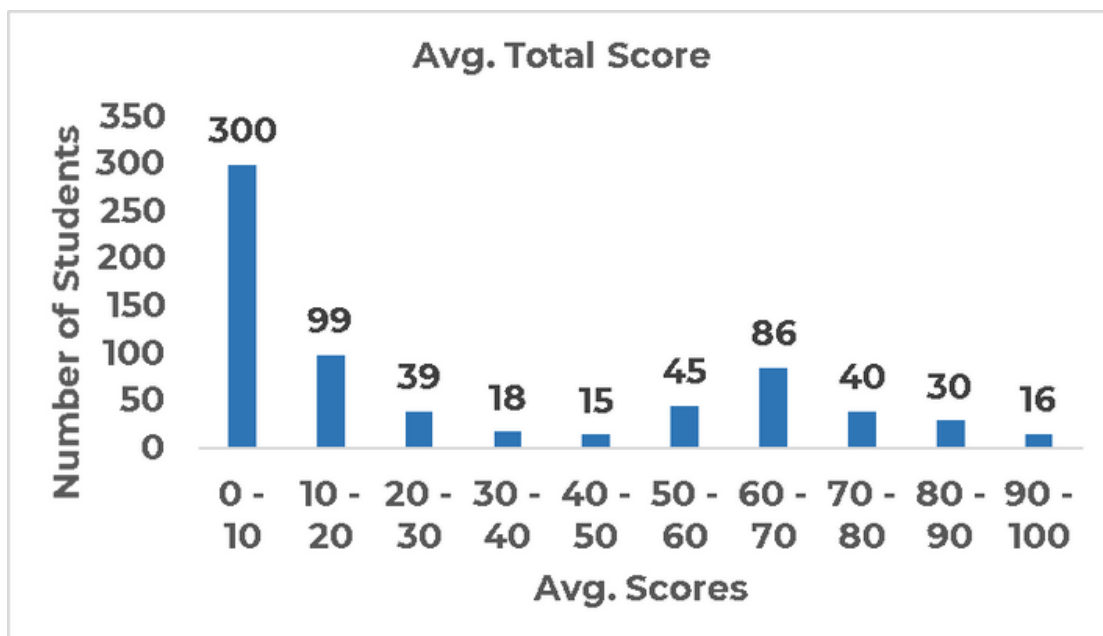

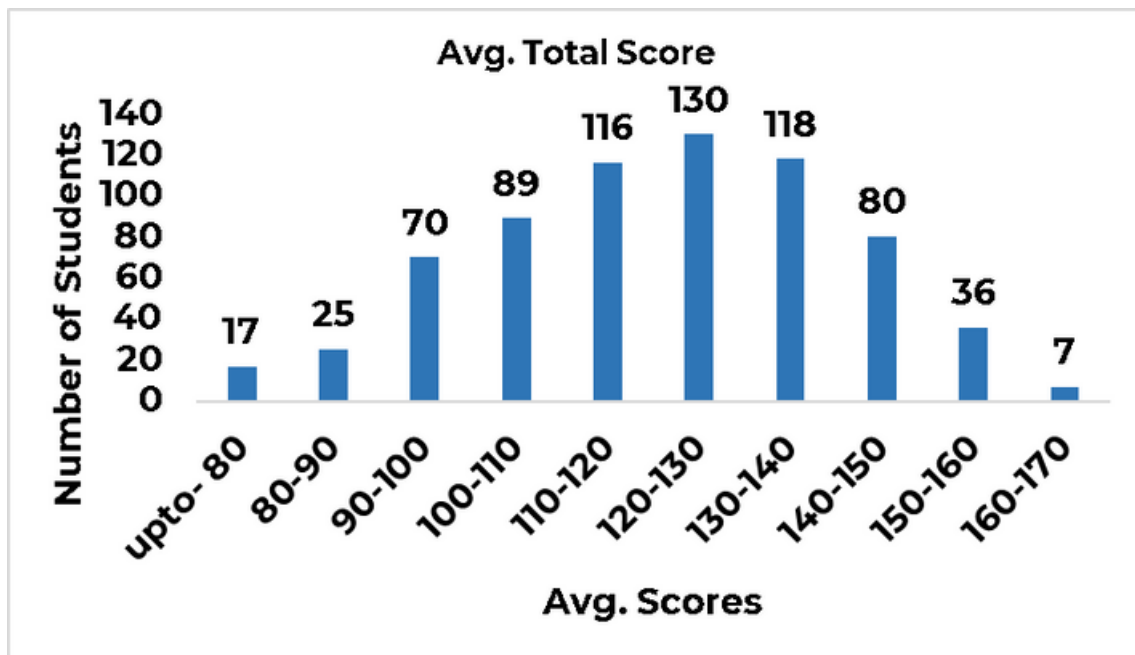
ASSESSMENT - CLEANLINESS



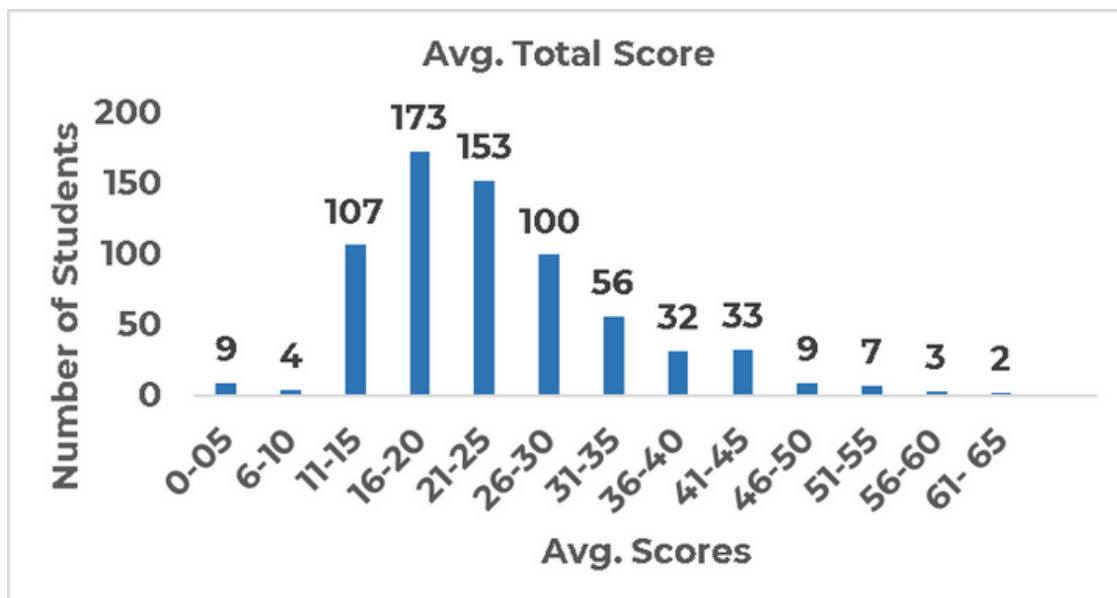
ASSESSMENT - TOTAL SCORE
